In January 1995 the Long Rivers Council and the Indian Trail Council Merged to form the Connecticut Rivers Council # 66. In the spring of that year a joint lodge meeting between Eluwak Lodge and Sassacus Lodge was held at [Camp Tadmia](#) in Bozrah. The name Tschitani was chosen as the name of the new lodge.

In the fall of 1995 a joint lodge conclave was held at [June Norcross Webster Scout Reservation](#) in Ashford this was the beginning of a new strong lodge. An Official Charter was given to the Tschitani Lodge on January 1, 1996.

Indian Trail Council is divided into 4 Districts. Each district forming it own Chapter making up the Sassacus Lodge.

"In the fall of 1971, the Eastern Connecticut Council (Quinnebaug, Natchaug and Mohegan Districts) Merged with the Pequot Council (Eastern and Western Districts) to form the Indian Trail Council of Eastern Connecticut. (Quinnebaug, Natchaug, Mohegan, Nehantic and Pequot Districts). As a result of the merger, Uncas Lodge #297 of Eastern Conn. Council was merged with the Samson Occum Lodge #388 of the Pequot Council to form the Sassacus Lodge #10. Sassacus was the last great Sachem of the fierce, warlike Pequot Indian Nation which inhabited Southeastern Conn. at the time of the European encroachment.

Edward C. Viner became elected the first Lodge Chief in the fall of 1972. The Lodge consisted of four Chapters, Mohegan, Pequot, Quinnebaug and Natchaug. The Pequot Indian Skull-cracker and shield were chosen as the Lodge Totems and a high screech as the call.

The first Fellowship was held at Camp June Norcross Webster Scout Reservation in Ashford, CT. in the fall of 1972. At the time it was proposed that the Lodge adopt a flap which had the following characteristics. The Skull-cracker and shield would appear on a gold background together with the lettering SASSACUS and an arrow with the letters WWW superimposed on it. The lettering and arrow were to be embroidered in red. The rim of the shield would be brown with a zig-zag pattern of blue. White feathers with red tips were suspended from the shield. The body of the skull-cracker was to be green with alternating teeth of red and white. The ball and handle of the skull-cracker were yellow. The border consisted of alternating bars of yellow and black. The number 10 was embroidered in black at the center of the shield and all outlining was in black. The prototype was rejected by the executive board upon delivery in 1974.

The first ordeal flap was adopted as the official Lodge Flap later in 1974. The Lodge totem appears on a yellow background with a rolled blue border. The handle of the skull-cracker is green with alternating red and white teeth; the ball and handle are gold; the shield has a brown border, an orange center with the number 10 embroidered in black and five white feathers with red tips. The letters SASSACCUS and WWW are embroidered in red and all outlining is in black. The flap has cloth backing.

The flap remained unchanged until 1978 when a red fleur-de-lis was added to comply with National standards.

In October of 1975, the four Chapters were Merged into two Chapters. The Mohegan and Pequot Chapters were Merged to form the South Chapter. Quinnebaug and Natchaug Chapters were to form the North Chapter. At the annual banquet, on Sept. 18, 1978, the executive board re-established the four Chapters.

The Lodge by-laws, which had been in existence since the formation of the Lodge had been subject to minor revisions through 1974. In 1978 the executive board undertook a major revision. The present by-laws were adopted on Nov. 19, 1978.

A Brotherhood-Vigil flap was approved by the executive board on Nov. of 1979. The arrow appearing on the Brotherhood Sash with the letters WWW superimposed upon it was placed above the Lodge Totem. The arrow was embroidered in red and the fleur-de-lis, WWW and all lettering in blue. The border was changed from blue to red and the size of the flap was slightly enlarged.”

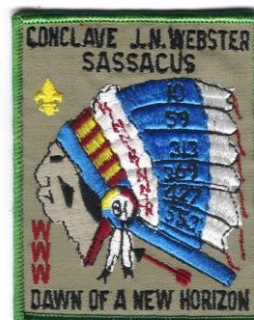

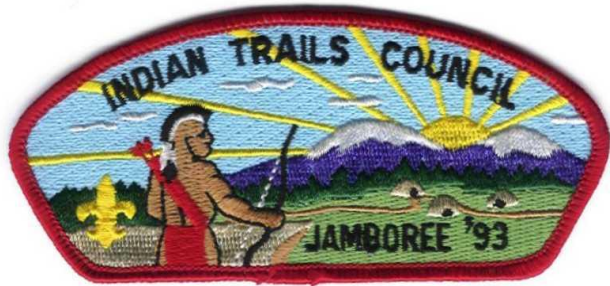

Eluwak was the name chosen for the new Order of the Arrow Lodge of the Council. Each of the Merged councils would form chapters within the new Lodge:  
Mattatuck Lodge- Mattatuck Council  
Tunxis Lodge- Tunxis Council  
Wipunquoak Lodge- Charter Oak Council  
Kiehtan Lodge- Middlesex County Council  
Wangunks- Nathan Hale Council.

David Ramsey was selected to serve as first Chief

The Lodge served the Central and Northern part of Connecticut for next 23 years.

Eluwak Lodge would merge with Sassacus Lodge of Indian Trail Council in 1995 to form Tschitani Lodge of the Conn. Rivers Council.

In its 23 years of existence, Eluwak Lodge would have a National Lodge Chief as well as several Regional and Sectional Chiefs.
